Information regarding tax rates represents a "snapshot" in time and may change. It is difficult to predict tax rates without having actual proposals for annexation or incorporation, and what choices will be made regarding service levels. It is also difficult to do an "apples to apples" comparison between cities' tax rates as they use different methods of accounting. These figures may not take into account taxes assessed for capital improvements (i.e. sidewalks) through a Special Improvement District (SID), or different levels of services among cities and the county. Whatever choices residents make, police, fire and other municipal services will continue to be provided, if not by Salt Lake County then by a new or existing city. In any case, Salt Lake County will continue to exist to provide certain services.
